
New OTs to clear surgery backlog

KOTA KINABALU: The Queen Elizabeth Hospital here will have three new operating theatres (OTs) built in a containerstyled Mobile Surgical Units (MSUs) to help ease backlog of surgery cases.

The MSUs are expected to be commissioned in two weeks.

The hospital's Head of Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Department Dr Charanjeet Singh said the additional MSUs would help reduce the backlog of surgery cases faced by the hospital.

"We'll be having eight OTs to meet the hospital's growing requirements," he told a media briefing on the launching of the

MSUs here yesterday.

The MSUs consist of eight containersized compartments with three fully functional OTs specially designed to allow more room for mobility within the OT.

The MSUs are a pre-fabricated facility provided by Johnson Medical Equipment Sdn Bhd.

"With the existing number of OTs, we are
